**ORDER REGARDING STIPULATIONS RE FACTS, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
AND DISPOSITION**

This Order vacates General Order 17-04, filed on July 27, 2017.

Until further order of this court, any Stipulation Re Facts, Conclusions of Law and Disposition (stipulation), in which the respondent has a prior record of discipline (final or not), must attach to the stipulation, at the time it is lodged with this court, only the following specific documents to evidence that prior record of discipline:

(1) If the prior record involves a case type other than a conviction referral matter, an authenticated copy of any State Bar Court review department opinion, hearing department decision (unless there is a superseding review department opinion), or stipulation, including any order modifying or correcting an opinion, decision or stipulation, and any Supreme Court Order imposing the discipline recommended by the State Bar Court.

(2) If the prior record involves a conviction referral matter, an authenticated copy of any review department order referring the conviction matter to the hearing department, review department opinion, hearing department decision (unless there is a superseding review department opinion), or stipulation, including any order modifying or correcting an opinion, decision or stipulation, and any Supreme Court Order imposing the discipline recommended by the State Bar Court.

(3) Discipline records from any jurisdiction set forth in Business and Professions Code section 6049.1 that are comparable to the documents described in (1) and (2), above.

In addition, any stipulation submitted in a proceeding pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6049.1 must attach to the stipulation, at the time it is lodged with this court: (1) a certified copy of the findings and final order of the foreign jurisdiction; and (2) a copy of the rules, statutes, or court orders of the foreign jurisdiction which respondent has been found to have violated.
